Leading the way in research and technology, the Jordan Research Center is due



to break ground in the spring of 2014. The project, made possible by a generous gift from the Jordan Family, will strengthen relationships with educational partners and leaders across multi-faceted industries through research opportunities and collaborations. While funds have already been generously donated to construct this new leading-edge research center, the university seeks further philanthropic support to ensure the laboratories in this building will remain the most technologically advanced while providing modules and interactive spaces conducive to a comfortable, collaborative learning environment.

This first-of-its-kind research center on a California State University campus will be designed to change and grow with science, linking students and faculty with industry leaders in various fields to nurture a cohesive, knowledge-sharing environment through interdisciplinary collaboration and research.



Foster Farms Poultry Education Research Facility was dedicated on the farm at Fresno State earlier this year. Jordan College dean, Dr. Charles Boyer joined Foster Farms CEO Ron Foster and others on March 11 to dedicate the research facility, a first of its kind at a University. This state-of-the-art poultry facility, made possible by a gift from Foster Farms, is the first in the nation to receive certification from the American Humane Association TM(AHA). The 16,320 squarefoot building houses an eco-friendly research and training center that replicates professional poultry production for more than 500 students in the Animal Sciences and Agricultural Education department. It features advanced temperature control, monitoring and feed delivery systems.

New Gibson Farm Market opens on campus

On March 18, the university celebrated the grand opening of a new Rue and Gwen Gibson Farm Market on the Fresno State campus. The new 4,800 square foot market has 2,500 square feet of retail floor space, nearly double that of the original facility. New features include a hand-dipped ice cream counter and wine tasting room. The market is open 9am - 6pm, Mon – Fri, 9am - 4pm, Sat and 11am - 4pm, Sunday.

The new market was made possible because of a \$1.5 million dollar bequest from the estate of Joyce Mae Gibson. When the gift was announced in 2008, the Farm Market was renamed to honor her parents, Rue and Gwen Gibson.
