


VERC Services

Lab Services

VERC offers a variety of lab services to assist with Viticulture and Enology research. The following tests are available to affiliated researchers and student researchers for a fee.

- FTIR analysis of must, must under fermentation, and wine samples with the WineScan instrument.
- High performance liquid chromatography to analyze anthocyanins and phenolic acids.
- Automated photometric analysis for grape juice and wine samples using the Thermo Gallery Plus Discrete Analyzer (located in JARC).
